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| Aesthetics (A) | Studio Art, Art History, Cinema, Creative Writing, Dance, Music, Theater |
| Global <br> Interdependencies (G) | Intro to Geography, World/Global History, International Politics/Relations/Affairs, Intro <br> to Cultural Anthropology, Intro to Social Anthropology, Intro to Art History |
| Humanities (H) | English Literature, Comparative Literature, Philosophy (excluding reasoning/logic) |
| Lab Science (L) | Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Geology, Physics |
| Mathematics (M) | Calculus, Statistics, Logic/Reasoning |

> General education courses may not be taken pass/fail; they must be taken for a letter grade.
$>$ General Education courses must be at least 3 credits (exceptions: O, B, Y, S).
